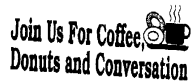

A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the 5th Sunday of Easter and the First Reading is from the Acts of the Apostles (9:26-31). Saul is a changed man. He has encountered the Risen Christ and has become a Christian. He arrives in Jerusalem and tries to join the disciples, but they are afraid of him. They remember how he persecuted the Church and approved of Stephen being stoned to death.

Fortunately, Barnabas “took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus.” The rest, as they say, is history. Saul would be named Paul and would become arguably the greatest missionary in the history of the Church.

It is important not to overlook the importance of Barnabas in this passage. Barnabas vouched for Saul’s genuine desire to join the Christian community. In some sense, Barnabas can be seen as “sponsoring” Saul before the apostles.

The role of a sponsor in the Church is an important one. A person chosen to be a sponsor (i.e. godparent) for baptism or for confirmation has a vital role in the life of the Church. They are to be fully initiated Catholics who practice their faith. If married, they are to be validly married in eyes of the Catholic Church according to Canon Law. Furthermore, they are to ensure that the child to be baptized will be raised in the Catholic faith should the child’s parents die or be otherwise unable to do so. The choice of a sponsor should be made carefully and prayerfully.

May God bless our newly confirmed and all those families whose children will be baptized in the coming months.

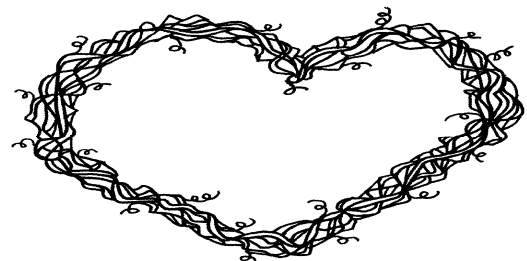
